Application Requirements

- Complete online application at graduate.auburn.edu.
- Transcripts from all institutions attended.
- Resumé, recommendation letters, GRE/GMAT scores, or statement of purpose may be required by some departments. Check the departmental website admission requirements for the program to which you wish to apply.
- \$60 domestic application fee; \$70 international application fee.

English proficiency requirement for international students:

- TOEFL: 550 pBT or 79 iBT (minimum 16 on each of the 4 sections of iBT); OR IELTS: 6.5 Overall Band Score.
